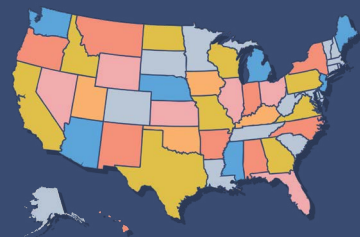

GEORGIANS: ELECTION DAY IS ALMOST HERE! WHAT IS YOUR VOTING PLAN?

With just a few days to go before Election Day, the following quick facts might be helpful to Georgia voters as you head to the polls.

Are you registered to vote? Do you know your polling location?

- Check your voter registration status [here](#).

Did you receive your sample ballot in the mail?

If not, visit your county election website to see your sample ballot!

How do you plan to vote?

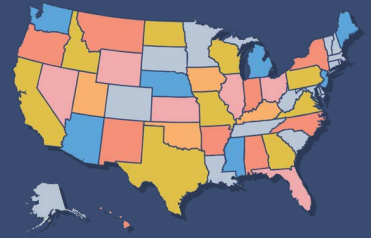
- In-person, early or on Nov. 3:
 - Don't forget your photo ID – you will be denied the chance to vote if you do not have one!
 - Early voting: Voting locations are open!
 - Last day to vote early: Friday, Oct. 30.
 - Did you know? You can vote at any early voting location in your county. Check [My Voter Page](#) to find yours.
- By mail:
 - Read the instructions carefully. Fill your ballot, and SIGN!
 - Ballots must be received by 7 p.m. on Election Day (Nov. 3). You can submit it in person at your local election office or at a drop-off location. Hand delivering your ballot to the local election board or to a dropbox is recommended at this point to ensure your ballot gets counted.

NOT SURE WHERE YOUR POLLING PLACE IS? LOG INTO "MY VOTER PAGE" TO FIND YOUR ASSIGNED POLLING LOCATION.

WORRIED YOU DON'T HAVE ENOUGH TIME TO MAIL IN YOUR BALLOT? VOTE IN PERSON!

DID YOU KNOW THAT MISSING SIGNATURES AND IMPROPERLY SIGNED RETURNS ARE THE MOST COMMON REASONS ABSENTEE BALLOTS ARE REJECTED? THIS WILL REQUIRE YOU TO TAKE MORE STEPS TO HAVE YOUR VOTE COUNT. SIGN YOUR ENVELOPE!

What forms of identification are acceptable in Georgia?

- Any valid state or federal government-issued photo ID, including a free ID card issued by your county registrar's office or the Georgia Department of Driver Services
- A Georgia driver's license, even if expired
- Valid employee photo ID from any branch, department, agency, or entity of the U.S. government, Georgia government, or any county, municipality, board, authority or other entity of this state
- Valid U.S. passport
- Valid U.S. military photo ID
- Valid tribal photo ID
- Some college IDs – see if your school ID is accepted [here](#)

Did you request an absentee ballot that hasn't yet arrived?

- You can cancel your absentee ballot by going to vote in person!

Did you request an absentee ballot but now want to vote in person?

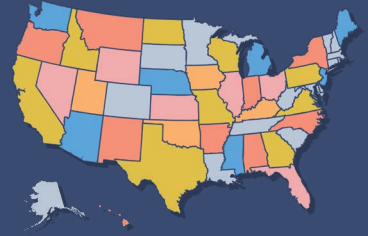
- You have the option to cancel the absentee ballot by going to vote in person. It's a good idea to take your uncast absentee ballot with you to expedite the process at the polling location.
- If you have returned your voted absentee ballot, you will not be able to show up at the polls and cancel your vote.

Wondering what to do if your absentee ballot is rejected?

- Your county election official should contact you with options to "cure" your ballot. However, if you log into ["My Voter Page"](#) and discover that your ballot has not been accepted, then proactively contact your local election official.

What do I do if they tell me I am not allowed to vote?

- If you do not have your photo ID, or there is another complication that prevents you from casting a regular ballot, ask the poll worker to allow you to cast a provisional ballot.
- Casting a provisional ballot may require you to take extra steps before your ballot is counted, so be sure to ask the poll worker what else will be needed before you depart the precinct.

When might I be required to cast a provisional ballot?

- If you did not bring an ID to the polls, you have up to three days to visit your local elections office with your ID.
- If your name on the ID does not conform exactly with the polling book.
- If you show up at the wrong precinct or county and decide to vote there rather than going to the correct polling precinct.
- You can check the status of your provisional ballot at “My Voter Page.”

What happens with a provisional ballot?

- The polling officials will review them separately to determine whether the voter was eligible to cast a vote.
- If the voter’s identification is confirmed, the vote will be counted like any other vote.

IF YOU CAST A PROVISIONAL BALLOT, BE SURE TO ASK A POLL WORKER ABOUT ANY EXTRA STEPS YOU NEED TO TAKE TO BE SURE YOUR BALLOT IS COUNTED.
